The ESC is an excellent opportunity to help where needed, learn new skills, spend time abroad, maybe learn a language and definitely come back with unforgettable memories.


Most opportunities through the ESC are cross-border volunteering activities.

Cultural routes are a precious asset of the European Cultural Heritage.

They create connections between countries and people,
encourage mutual knowledge and physical activity,
and promote the spreading of associated cultural contents.

However, they need regular and dedicated maintenance in order to be available for walkers and riders all year round. In Trail Angels, teams of volunteers coming mostly from Northern Europe will be hosted in Tuscany to take care of the Via Francigena, one of the oldest and most important and famous of the European Cultural Routes.

Each team will cooperate to the ordinary maintenance of one single part of the Tuscan via, until the entirety of this beautiful cultural heritage will restored for pilgrims and tourists alike to walk on it again.

What will you do?

Moreover, you will:

- -socialize with their peers and create a network among them;
- -work in teams, which will provide an opportunity of intercultural and interreligious dialogue, as well as developing soft skills, leadership and problem-solving abilities;
- -develop other skills and competences which are useful for their personal, educational, social and professional development;
 - -promote the values of diversity and inclusivity, since at least three people for each Team will be young people with fewer opportunities, including refugees, asylum seekers and migrants;
 - -participate in an activity that allow them
 to gain awareness and understanding
 of other cultures and countries,
 to actively participate in society and
 to develop a sense of European citizenship and identity.



Via Francigena is one of the old pilgrimage routes that connected Europe in ancient times.

It starts from the city of Canterbury and crosses England, France and Switzerland to arrive in Rome, where begins a final stretch until Apulia.

The route was forgotten for centuries, but in the last decades this precious testimony of the past was rediscovered, and the ancient route was almost completely re-established.

Nowadays, it can be crossed again by pilgrims and nature lovers.

One of the most picturesque traits of the Via Francigena is in the Italian region of Tuscany.



Each volunteer will receive 150 € as pocket money each month.

Everything else, including accommodation, food and activity-related costs will be managed by the hosting organization.

International travel is also reimbursed. Volunteers will do their activities in a flexible way, for about 6 hours/day and 5 days every week.

Two days are free every week, besides these, all regional and national free days and holidays are also considered free for the volunteers.
